Notes: The 120,161 probable cases in Brazil were registered between epidemiological week (EW) 1 and EW 16 of 2016. This new data was reported by the Brazil Ministry of Health at: http://combateaeedes.saude.gov.br/images/sala-de-situacao/informe_microcefalia_epidemiologico24.pdf This replaces the previous data posted up to 27 April 2016, of 70,611 suspected Zika cases which had been obtained from unofficial sources.

Deaths among Zika cases do not include deaths related to Guillain-Barré syndrome (GBS) or congenital malformations associated with Zika virus infection. As of 5 May 2016, previously reported deaths related to GBS were removed from this total. Data is shared in an effort to transparently disseminate available information reported by Member States. Any subsequent interpretation and analysis of this data should consider differences in surveillance systems and reporting requirements.
