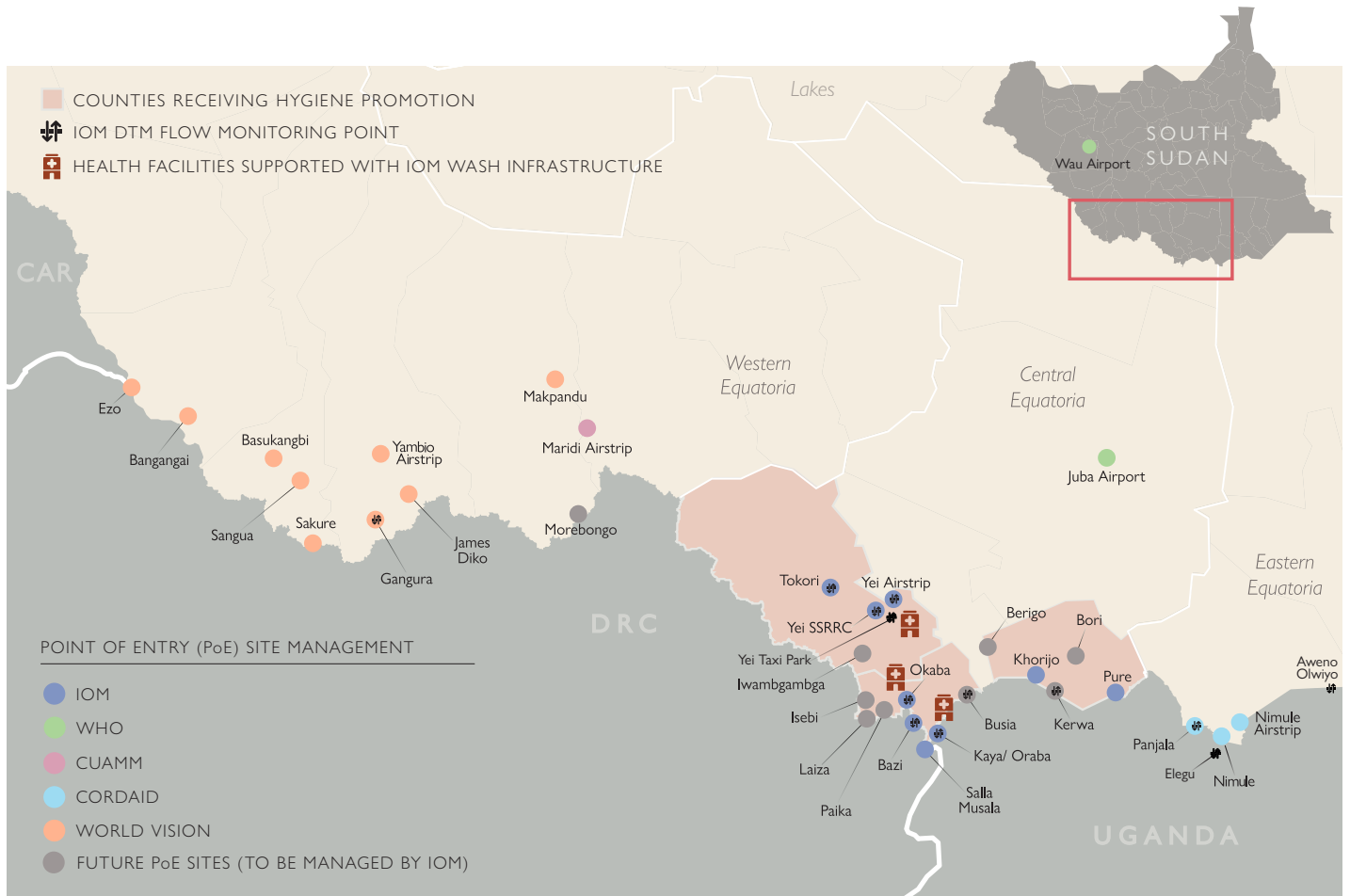

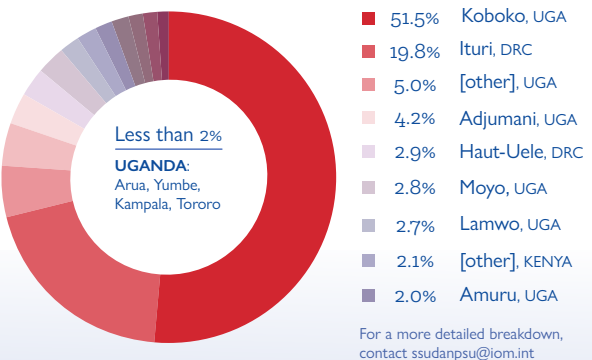

## ORIGIN OF ENTRANTS TO SOUTH SUDAN (n=7,058)

79.8% of surveyed travellers were South Sudanese nationals, 13.1% were Ugandan, 2.2% were Kenyan, and 1.4% were from other countries. Entrant origin information is self-reported.



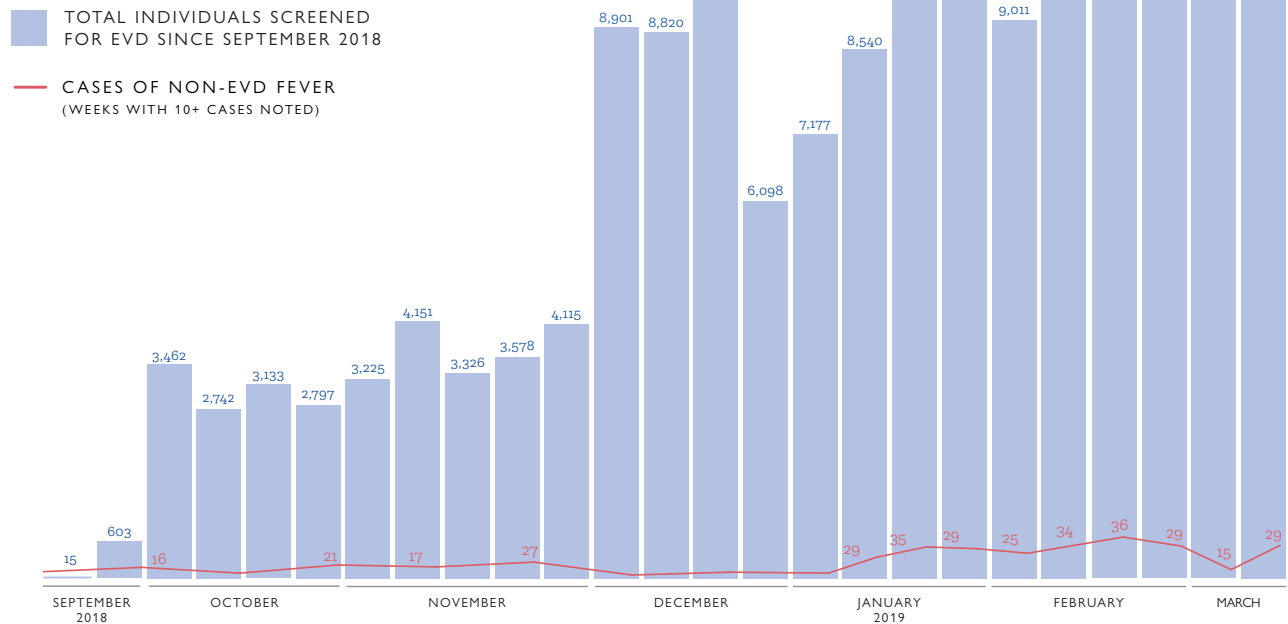
## WEEKLY OVERVIEW

- The construction of Busia PoE screening site is now 50% complete, and the Kerwa PoE screening site is 90% complete
- Five health and hygiene promoters have been recruited for the Salia Musala PoE site
- A WASH IPC assessment of Panyume primary health care facility (in Morobo) indicates that the WASH facilities (water distribution network and latrines) need improvement. The PHCU serves an average of 70 people per day
- 29 non-EVD fevers detected at EVD screening sites this reporting week. For further details please see the health update section on page 2

## HEALTH UPDATES

This reporting week recorded 12,556 travelers screened for EVD exposure and symptoms, which is a 8.98% increase compared to week 9. In Yei town, the increase in travelers is attributed to ease of movement given dry-season road conditions. There were 29 fever cases this week, 23 of which were detected at Bazi. Seven travellers were detained for high temperature of unknown origin, while 16 tested positive for malaria. All fevers were recorded and all patients treated at Rodoba primary healthcare unit.

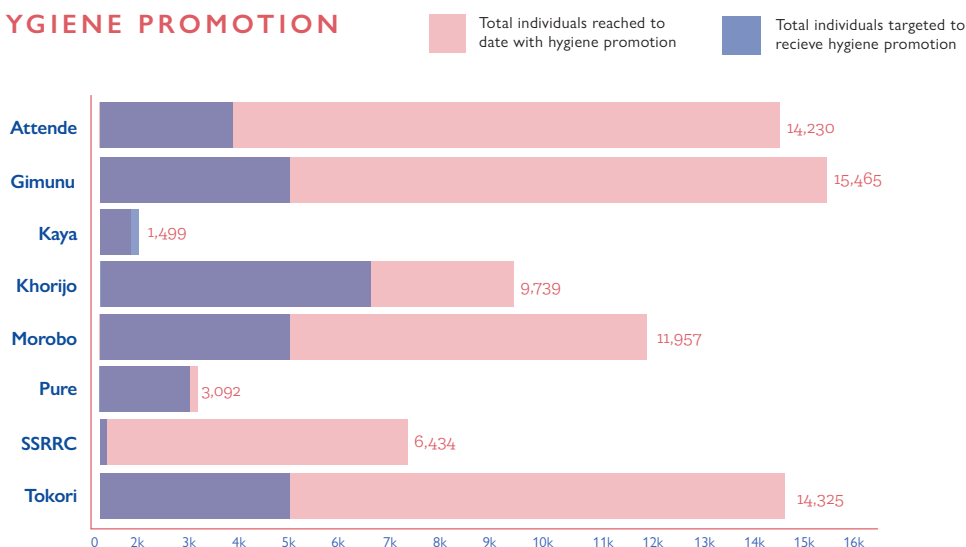
## WASH UPDATES

Construction of the screening sites at Busia and Kerwa remains ongoing, and mobilization of the construction materials for the screening site at Berigo has begun. Health and hygiene education continued at IOM's nine areas of operation, with sessions at schools, markets, and water points, reaching approximately 2,800 individuals, including 259 primary school students. Five new health and hygiene promoters have been selected to start educational activities at Salia Musala. Panyume PHCC and Morobo PHCC have been selected to receive waste management services (incinerators and waste pits).

## DTM UPDATES

Between 3-9 March, 7,058 people were surveyed by DTM FMPs on arrival to South Sudan from Uganda and the DRC. Only one FMP, Gangura, was unable to submit in time due to logistical challenges. The main regions of departure were Koboko in Uganda (51.5%) and Ituri in the DRC (19.8%). 70.1% of respondents were heading to destinations within Morobo county and 11.1% to Juba. 79.8% were South Sudanese nationals.

## SECURITY & ACCESS CHALLENGES

- Limited cellular network in Yei has hindered communication with teams and has delayed reports from the area
- Insecurity in the Logo area resulted in displacements to Yei, hindering hygiene promotion education in Pisak and Banambu Bomas
- Access denials have delayed the construction of PoE screening sites in Berigo and Bori
- Screening teams at Khorijo and Pure were not yet vaccinated as vaccination teams could not reach them this week

## COORDINATION NOTES

IOM is continuously attending the EVD weekly meetings at the national and state level. During this week in particular, IOM attended the monthly coordination meeting in Moyo for all partners working in Kajo Keji. This meeting focused on access to water which was identified as a significant service gap in Khorijo IDP camp.

IOM and local authorities reached an agreement regarding access to Berigo, Bori and other IO-controlled locations in this area.
