

### SITUATION

- There were 30 new confirmed cases of Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) in the three affected countries during the week ending 12 July, with 14 in Sierra Leone, 13 in Guinea and three in Liberia.
- More than six weeks after being declared EVD free, Liberia has again experienced new cases. The source of this new, third, wave in the EVD outbreak is as of yet unconfirmed and it is under investigation.
- There are still problems with community compliance with containment measures and problems with Infection Control in Health establishments.

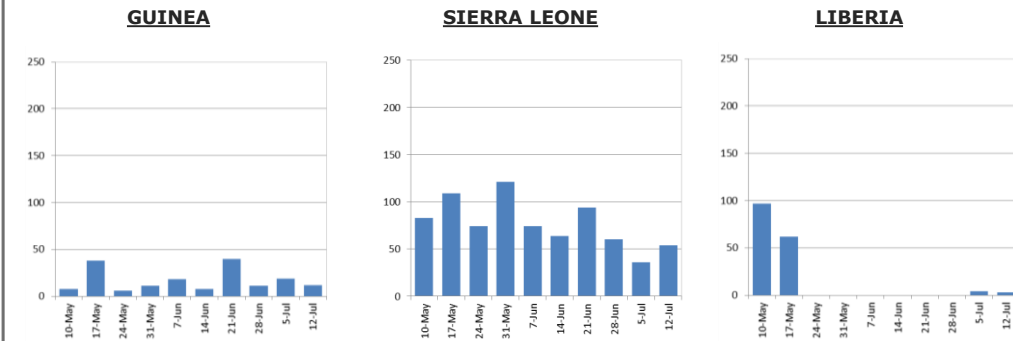

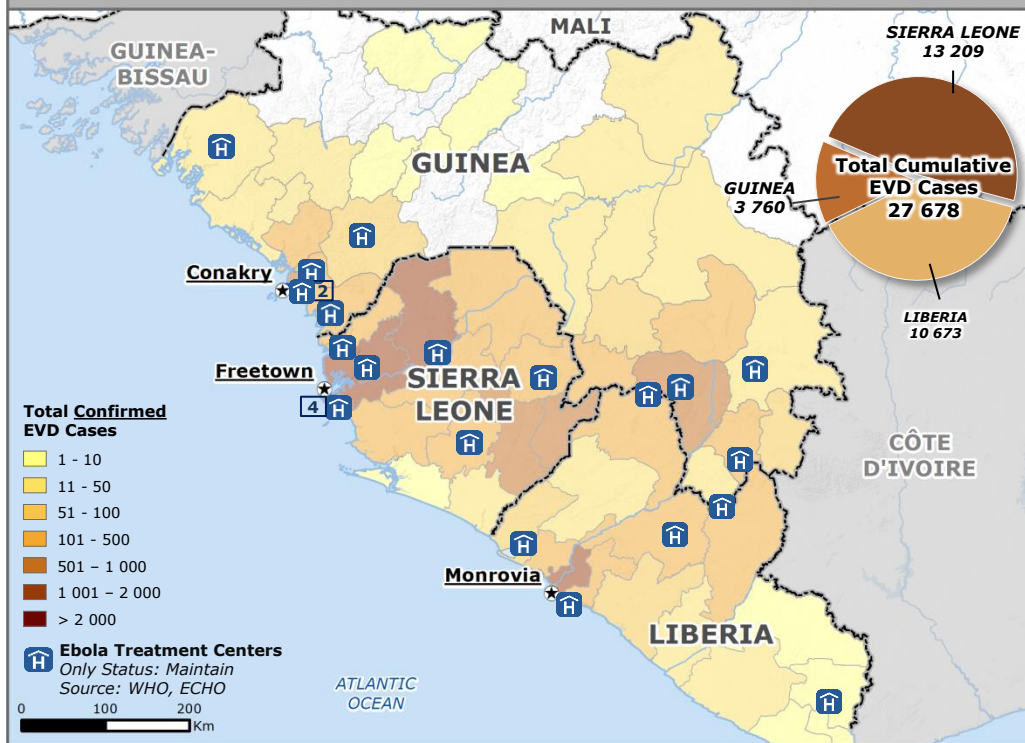
### NEW EVD CUMULATIVE CASES PER WEEK
