

# 2013 Nigeria Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS)

The 2013 Nigeria Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS) provides data for monitoring the population and health situation in Nigeria. The 2013 NDHS is the fifth Demographic and Health Survey conducted in the country. Repeated surveys allow for an analysis of trends over time.


The survey is based on a nationally representative sample. It provides estimates at the national level, geo-political zones, urban-rural breakdown, 36 states, and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT).

Births per woman for the 3 years prior to the survey


■ <5.0

Percent of currently married women age 15-49 who are currently using contraception



Percent of women age 15-49 with a live birth in the 5 years before the survey



Percent of households with:



Deaths per 1,000 live births



Percent of children age 12-23 months vaccinated



Percent of children under age 5, based on 2006 WHO Child Growth Standards




### Knowledge of HIV Prevention
