ON THE FRONT LINES OF ELIMINATION

Central to the Zambia's pursuit of the malaria parasite is the community health worker, serving on the front lines in our fight to eliminate the disease. Chosen by their own communities, these men and women are trained and equipped to follow up positive cases of malaria at the household level.

In Southern Province, more than 60 percent of malaria is now managed at the community level, freeing up facility staff to focus on other health issues. To expand this proven approach nationwide, we need to deploy 15,000 community health workers.

On the map, each red dot is a health facility; each green dot is a community health worker. Placing a trained community health worker amounts to establishing a convenient point of care.
