Definition of Terms

Congregation:

This term refers to members of a specific religious group who regularly worship at a church, synagogue, mosque or temple.

Congregational leader:

The term congregational leader refers to a person of faith who is formally recognized by the congregation of which they are a part, as the reference point, and often the link for the congregation with the religious leaders such as the youth leader, women/men's leader etc.

Faith Leader:

A leader recognized within the faith community.

Faith Sector:

This term is used to refer to both faith communities and faith-based organizations

Gender-Based Violence (GBV):

This is defined as any act of violence vetted against a person because of their gender that results in physical, sexual or psychological harm or suffering, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivations of liberty, whether occurring in public or private life. The forms of GBV are sexual, physical, emotional, psychological and socio-economic violence, harmful traditional practices and trafficking in persons.

Religious Leader:

The term religious leader refers to a person of faith who is formally recognized by the religious community of which they are a part, as the reference point, and often the decision maker, for matters of doctrine, faith, practice and often governance.

Sexual Violence:

Includes rape, attempted rape, defilement, incest, sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, forced prostitution, torture and trafficking for sexual exploitation.

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Introduction

The National AIDS Control Council continues to strengthen engagement with Faith Communities (FCs) and Faith Based Organizations (FBOs) through the Faith Sector Working Group. A Faith Sector Action plan was developed, aligned to Kenya AIDS Strategic Framework (KASF) launched and disseminated. The Faith Communities and Faith Based Organizations shall deliver KASF through implementation of the Faith Sector Action Plan.

The Action Plan identifies key activities that can be implemented by the Faith Communities and Faith Based organizations This include; mainstream HIV messages into Faith Sector activities, reach out to the congregation with HIV prevention information and services targeting men, women, adolescent, youth and young people, reducing HIV Related Stigma.

To strengthen Mainstreaming of HIV messages in Sermons, the Faith Sector Working Group with support of Christian and Muslim Theologians have developed HIV Thematic messages that are Bible and Qur'an referred. The Themes covered are Knowledge, HIV prevention, Treatment and Adherence, Timely Care and Support and Elimination of Stigma and Discrimination.

The Objective of the HIV Message Booklet is to support religious leaders to Mainstream HIV messages into sermons and any relevant activities such as pre-marital Counseling, weddings celebrations etc. This booklet can be a guide and a resource. As a country we also need to meet global targets of " 90,90,90.

Christian Scripture: On Prevention

(Scripture given here below may not be direct but can be applied to the topic)

Ex 1: 15-21

"the king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives, whose names were Shiphrah and Puah, ¹⁶ "When you are helping the Hebrew women during childbirth on the delivery stool, if you see that the baby is a boy, kill him; but if it is a girl, let her live." ¹⁷ The midwives, however, feared God and did not do what the king of Egypt had told them to do; they let the boys live. ¹⁸ Then the king of Egypt summoned the midwives and asked them, "Why have you done this? Why have you let the boys live?"¹⁹ The midwives answered Pharaoh, "Hebrew women are not like Egyptian women; they are vigorous and give birth before the midwives arrive."²⁰ So God was kind to the midwives and the people increased and became even more numerous. ²¹ And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families of their own"

1 Sam: 1: 21-23 (exclusive breastfeeding)

"Hannah did not go. She said to her husband, "After the boy is weaned, I will take him and present him before the LORD, and he will live there always.²³ "Do what seems best to you," her husband Elkanah told her. Use of Mid-wives to give delivery at Health Facilities is emphasized

FAITH SECTOR KEY HIV MESSAGES FOR MAINSTREAMING



Treatment controls the virus and helps prevent transmission so that people with HIV and those at risk can enjoy healthy and productive lives. ARVs help to prolong and improve the quality of life of those infected with HIV.





HIV TREATMENT & ADHERENCE



FACTS:

- Anti-retroviral (ARVs) are free in all public and faith based hospitals providing HIV care
- Anti-retroviral (ARVs) work by reducing levels of HIV virus in the body
- Good adherence to Anti-retroviral (ARVs) reduces resistance to HIV medication
- Daily correct use of ARVs promotes good health and prolongs life



MESSAGES TO CONGREGANTS:

- Starting treatment early promotes good health, prolongs life, keeps families together and reduces the number of Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVC)
- ARVs work and lead to viral suppression giving hope to millions of PLHIV and their families.
- A person living with HIV can be treated and live a healthy normal life.
- In case one believes he/she is healed/cured; he/she should seek medical confirmation from a certified health care worker before stopping their medication..
- Positive living brings change and hope.
- It is important to have faith and hope as you continue with treatment.
- Ensure those who need treatment are able to access it
- Support those infected to adhere to treatment through the buddy system (accountability partner)
- Provide resources needed to adhere to treatment such as food, transport among other



ACTION POINTS:

• Form Psychosocial support groups for children, Adolescents and Young people, families and adults



MYTHS & MISCONCEPTIONS:

- HIV is curable.
- Having sex with a virgin or a child can cure HIV.
- PLHIV cannot have children who are HIV negative .
- HIV always leads to AIDS.
- Herbal medicine cures HIV.
- When one believes in faith healing there is no need to continue taking ARVs.
- It is okay to share ARVs with my spouse.

b) On Medication

There are many Ahadith (traditions of Prophet Muhammad peace be upon him (pbuh) which encourage the Muslims to seek medical treatment. Some of them are mentioned below:

Abu Hurayrah narrates that The Prophet pbuh said:

"There is no disease that Allah has created, except that He also has created its remedy."

Bukhari 7.582

Usamah ibn Shuraik narrated:

"... 'O Allah's Messenger! Should we seek medical treatment for our illnesses?' He replied: 'Yes, you should seek medical treatment, because Allah, the Exalted, has let no disease exist without provid- ing for its cure, except for one ailment, namely, old age'."

Tirmidhi

Taking proper care of one's health is considered by the Prophet Muhammad pbuh to be the right of the body.

Bukhari as-Sawm 55, an-Nikah 89, Muslim as- siyyam 183, 193, Nisai

The Prophet not only instructed sick people to take medicine, but he himself invited expert physicians for this purpose.

Timely care, spiritual and psychosocial support leads to effective treatment in management of HIV when the body immunity is still strong.







FACTS:

- Immediate support enhances self-acceptance of status and health seeking behaviour.
- Timely psychosocial and spiritual care and support is a protective factor for PLHIV.
- Timely care and support would prevent further transmission of HIV.
- Early care and support enhances adherence to treatment and prolongs life.



MESSAGES TO CONGREGANTS:

- When PLHIV are supported, it upholds human dignity, gives hope and reassures the presence of God in the in people's lives.
- All people are equal before God, He cares for us equally regardless of status.
- You are either infected or affected and hence the need to create safe spaces for PLHIV.
- HIV is a chronic condition. If managed in an environment of love, acceptance and care one's quality of life in the community will be enhanced.
- Encouraging exclusive breast feeding and sensitizing the family, improves their quality of life .
- Service to PLHIV is service to God.



ACTION POINTS:

- Involve PLHIV in social and spiritual groups at family and congregational and community level.
- Mobilize congregation to provide food, clothing, shelter

and education for PLHIV and OVC.

- Carry out regular home visitations and prayers to families in the congregation affected by HIV.
- Refer those in need of support and care to relevant institutions.
- Encourage volunteerism among health professionals and other specialists within congregations.
- Form psychosocial support groups for children, young people, women and men.



MYTHS & MISCONCEPTIONS:

Myth 1: You'll Know You Have HIV Because Of Your Symptoms

Explanation:

Some people don't show any signs of HIV for years after being infected. Many can have some symptoms within 10 days to a few weeks after infection. These first symptoms are similar to the flu and may include fever, fatigue, rash, and sore throat. They usually disappear after a few weeks and you may not have symptoms again for several years. The only way to tell you have HIV is to get tested.

Myth 2: HIV Can Be Cured

Explanation:

At this time, there is no cure for HIV, but treatment can keep virus levels low and helps maintain your immune system. In Kenya all HIV infected persons need to be on treatment regardless of their immune (CD4) status.

Myth 3: My partner and I are both HIV positive, so we don't have to practice safe sex.

Explanation:

Practicing safe sex prevents you from re-infection

of HIV and of drug resistant strains of the virus.

Myth 4: I am using birth control, I cannot get HIV.

Explanation:

HIV can be spread during any unsafe or unprotected sex with a HIV positive partner.

Most forms of birth control only protect against unwanted pregnancy, Not sexually transmitted infections such as HIV, Herpes, Gonorrhea and Syphilis.

Myth 5: My HIV positive child does not need to take ARVs because we are going to die anyway.

Myth 6: I still look healthy so why take medication?

The Messenger of Allah said, "Every Muslim has five rights over another Muslim to return the greetings of salam, to visit the sick, to accompany funeral processions, to accept an invitation, to respond to the sneezer. [al-Bukhari and Muslim]

To stop a person falling in the trap of worry and anxiety we have been advised that: "Imaan (Faith) is between fear and Hope!" Mishkat

HIV stigma remains a key challenge and is the main barrier to testing, access to counseling, care and treatment.





DEFINITION:

What is Stigma?

Stigma is a negative attitude toward people who have characteristics that make them different from what people think is right or normal. Most people who are living with HIV end up being stigmatized, regardless of the behaviors in which they may have engaged.

What is discrimination?

Discrimination describes the actual ways that people are treated worse than others because they are stigmatized and/or different. Discrimination against people living with HIV means that they are treated unfairly/badly or do not have certain rights because they are HIV positive.



FACTS

- 1. PLHIV are stigmatized and discriminated against consciously or unconsciously. As a result:
- We fear testing for HIV.
- We fear being judged by others.
- There is failure to adhere to medication such as ARVs.
- Fear of going for care.
- There is reduced quality of life.
- 2. Stigma and discrimination leads to:
- Non-disclosure of HIV status
- Loss of income/livelihood
- Increases vulnerability especially for children, young girls and women (NB: Add a point on sexuality & gender)



MESSAGES TO CONGREGANTS:

- HIV is a virus. Anyone can be infected. We are all at risk.
- We are ALL created in the image of God. I am a child of God regardless of my HIV status.
- God is love therefore HIV is not a punishment from God
- A child living with HIV cannot transmit the virus to other children through normal church, school and social activities.
- People living with HIV are much more than their HIV status, they deserve to live full healthy lives, have and fulfill their dreams and aspirations.
- HIV is like any other health condition. Action Points:
- Get tested for HIV today and know your status.
- Embrace and bear with each other.
- Be each other's Keeper. True religion takes care of everyone.
- Create a conducive environment at home, in the places of worship and in the community.
- Let us come together and stand against HIV stigma and discrimination
- Do not give up. The future still holds a lot for us.



MYTHS & MISCONCEPTIONS:

Myth 1: Having HIV Means You Have AIDS

Explanation:

• Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) is a virus that destroys the body's CD4 immune cells, which help

fight disease. With the right medication, you can have HIV for years or decades without HIV progressing to AIDS. AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome) is diagnosed when you have HIV as well as certain opportunistic infections or your CD4 cell count drops below 200.

Myth 2: People who are living with HIV are promiscuous Explanation:

- HIV can be transmitted from mother to child during pregnancy, labor and delivery or breastfeeding
- HIV can be transmitted through blood transfusion with unscreened blood
- HIV can be transmitted by sharing unsterilized needles, syringes, tattooing instruments
- Myth 3: I am HIV positive. My life is over. HIV is a death sentence.
- Myth 4: HIV is a curse thus the need for spiritual cleansing.

Explanation:

• HIV is a virus and is not caused by a curse.

And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!"²² On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³ and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, ²⁴ while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, ²⁵ so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other.²⁶ If one part suffers, every part suffers with it, if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it."
