METHODOLOGY

Desk based review:

- Scoping review of published literature relating to women and PPE
- Collation of media reports about PPE during the pandemic

Online survey:

- Co-designed and tested tool with group of health workers
- Survey tool was translated into French, Spanish and Arabic
- The surveys were open for six weeks from end of June to mid-August 2021
- Responses were downloaded and analysed using both quantitative and qualitative methods

Interviews:

- Interviews with self-selecting survey respondents were also undertaken to provide additional data
- 15 interviews were completed with health workers from: Pakistan, India (2), Uganda, Zambia (2), South Africa (2), Malawi, China, Taiwan, UK (2), Australia, USA

Data analysis:

- Quantitative data was cleaned, and descriptive analysis undertaken using Stata (see tables below)
- Qualitative data was cleaned, and thematic analysis undertaken using NVivo

One of the many gender inequities in the health and care workforce that COVID-19 has exposed is around the fit and design of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). The rapid onset and scale of COVID-19 led to shortages of PPE in most countries, causing preventable infection and mortality among healthcare workers and others on the front lines. Even though most health workers are women, manufacturing specifications for medical PPE are usually drawn up based on the male body; for example, surgical masks may be too large to fit women's faces, increasing their risk of infection. During the pandemic there have been many reports of the negative impacts of PPE not designed for women's bodies and physiological functions.

PPE, like all products, is produced in compliance with standards. Working with partners including ASTM International and the International Finance Corporation (IFC), building on the UN Economic Commission for Europe's 'Gender-responsive Standards Declaration', and under the umbrella of Gender Equal Health and Care Workforce Initiative, Women In Global Health is launching a new research project on gender equity and PPE.

Through this survey we are seeking to better understand the scale and scope of medical PPE challenges faced by women on the front lines of COVID-19. We will use the information gathered to highlight common and context specific issues around PPE, and bring them to the attention of health system and industry decision makers.

CONSENT
