Oxycodone

- Drug Class: Opiate
- Found in: Percocet, Oxycontin
- Legality: Schedule II
 - Need a prescription!
- Positive Effects:
 - o Euphoria
 - o Analgesia
 - Full body relaxation

• Negative Effects:

- \circ Constipation
- Respiratory Depression
- Confusion
- Fast or slow heart beat
- Mechanism of Action
 - See image to the right
- Withdrawal symptoms
 - Feeling horrible physical and psychological pain
 - o Anxiety
 - Increased sensitivity to pain
 - o Diarrhea
 - Runny nose
- Treatment
 - Antagonist Therapy
 - Given a medication that blocks the effects of the oxycodone





- Naloxone
- Naltrexone
- Subsitution Therapy
 - Given a medication that binds to the same receptor but induces a milder effect
 - Methadone
 - Buprenorphine
- In case of an overdose
 - Must be rushed to the Emergency Room
 - Will be given Naloxone to block the effects and induce withdrawal
 - Will be monitored for respiratory failure
